Emergency Preparedness Committee - Karol Stevens – Rosie Watne, Judy Kelly, Don & Karol Stevens completed the bag inventory and is working on gathering a few supplies for replacement. Karol & Don got some free N95 masks from the Kitsap Health Dept. so we were able to put more in the bags this time.

Port of Keyport – Gene Warden – Still on hold for the contractors so work hasn't started yet and no date for that to begin.

Keyport Beautification – Peg Garrison – She has ordered the plants for next years baskets. A \$200.00 motion was made and passed for the 2022 baskets expense.

Annual Budget Committee Status – Jason Ward provided a spreadsheet with the Income and Expense for the club for the last 3 yrs. The committee will meet one more time in Dec. and determine the annual fundraising events needed based on this data. The decision will be brought to the January 11th meeting.

NEW BUSINESS:

Keyport Bible Church – Pie Donation – Karol Stevens reported that Pastor Daniells asked her if the Keyport Improvement Club could help them with publicizing to the community the opportunity for pie delivery for people that are interested. This will be done via a MailChimp email, and Facebook.

While talking with him, Karol inquired if the church has anyone that can help with community tasks involving ladders and he replied that they should be able to help us with that. More information will be coming on this.

Holiday Plans 2021 – Plans are in work for decorating the Central Park tree and fence areas which we need volunteers for again. Milt Meeds and Ellen Strong are heading up the effort this year. A suggestion was made to do this on Thanksgiving week-end providing the weather cooperates.

More information will be provided in a community email as the plans stabilize. Ellen could use 5 people for her team.

A motion was made to have a Solstice Walk and Holiday Light Luminaire Contest on Dec. 21st with items from the Keyport Swag going to the winner. More information will be distributed in the future. Peg Garrison will head the planning for this event.

Dec. 4th - Hanging holiday and memorial ornaments on a tree in Central Park along with lighting the big tree. The event of hanging ornaments will continue Dec. 11th and the 21st.

Dec. 4th - The Poulsbo Fire Dept. Santa will visit at 5:30 in Central Park.

Dec. 11th – The Poulsbo Yacht Club Lighted Boat Parade passing by Keyport at 5:50 PM.

Dec. 21st - A Solstice Walk along with a Holiday Light & Luminaires Contest.

Patti Corcoran will take the lead on the holiday donations at the Merc again this year. A motion was made and approved for \$350.00 from KIC and will include the cash donation jar at the Merc which will be donated to Stand Up For Kids again.

A motion was made and approved for \$150.00 for the holiday lights for the new fence at Central Park.

A decision to reinvent the 4th of July celebration in 2022 was discussed because the annual breakfast is a lot of work for little return. The raffle brings in more money and requires less work and volunteers. Several ideas were expressed and a decision will be made in the New Year.

Brownsville is interested in starting a club like ours and reached out to Karol Stevens. She attended a meeting and one idea suggested was that we have a combined garage sale with them. More information will follow as they develop their club.

Jim Barnes has a couple of ideas for Keyport. One is getting an Amazon Drop Box because our post office has limited hours and does not allow for a more efficient delivery of packages.

The other is getting an electric car charging station. Currently, there are no Tesla charging stations in Kitsap County.

The owner of the restaurant that will eventually be Rendezvous has expressed his willingness to speak at a meeting to provide an update on their progress. This will possibly be at the Feb. 8, 2022 meeting.
